SECTION A

GENERAL RFP TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1 INTRODUCTION

The Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) is one of the leading scientific research and technology development organisations in Africa. In partnership with national and international research and technology institutions, the CSIR undertakes directed and multidisciplinary research and technology innovation that contributes to the improvement of the quality of life of South Africans. The CSIR's main site is in Pretoria while it is represented in other provinces of South Africa through regional offices.

2 SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS

- 2.1 All proposals are to be submitted electronically to tender@csir.co.za. No late proposals will be accepted.
- 2.2 All proposals will only be considered if received by the CSIR before the closing date and time (as indicated on the cover page). The CSIR business hours are between **08h00** and **16h30**.
- 2.3 All proposal submissions are to be clearly subject referenced with the RFP Description. Proposals must consist of two parts, each of which must be sent in two separate emails with the following subject:
 - PART 1: Technical Proposal (Please indicated the RFP Number on each File/folder)
 PART 2: Pricing Proposal, Specific Goals claim documentation: RFP No.: (Please indicated the RFP Number on each File/folder)
- 2.4 Proposals submitted must be signed by a person or persons duly authorised.
- 2.5 Proposals submitted at incorrect location and/or address, will not be accepted for considerations and where practicable, will be returned unopened to the Bidder(s).
- 2.6 Proposals received after the closing date and time, at the address indicated in the bid documents, will not be accepted for consideration and where practicable, will be returned unopened to the Bidder(s).
- 2.7 All dates and times in this bid are South African standard time.

2.8 Any time or date in this bid is subject to change at the CSIR's discretion. The establishment of a time or date in this bid does not create an obligation on the part of the CSIR to take any action or create any right in any way for any bidder to demand that any action be taken on the date established. The bidder accepts that, if the CSIR extends the deadline for bid submission (the Closing Date) for any reason, the requirements of this bid otherwise apply equally to the extended deadline.

2.9 Documents submitted via cloud solutions such as: WeTransfer, Google Drive, Dropbox, etc. will not be considered.

2.10 The naming / labelling syntax of files or documents must be short and simple.

2.11 The CSIR will award the contract to qualified bidder(s)' whose proposal is determined to be the most advantageous to the CSIR, taking into consideration the technical (functional) solution, price, specific goals and objective criteria.

3 COUNTER CONDITIONS

Bidders' attention is drawn to the fact that amendments to any of the RFP Conditions or setting of counter conditions by Bidders or qualifying any RFP Conditions will result in the invalidation of such bids.

4 FRONTING

4.1 Government supports the spirit of broad based black economic empowerment and recognizes that real empowerment can only be achieved through individuals and businesses conducting themselves in accordance with the Constitution and in an honest, fair, equitable, transparent and legally compliant manner. Against this background the Government condemn any form of fronting.

4.2 The Government, in ensuring that Bidders conduct themselves in an honest manner will, as part of the RFP evaluation processes, conduct or initiate the necessary enquiries/investigations to determine the accuracy of the representation made in bid documents. Should any of the fronting indicators as contained in the Guidelines on Complex Structures and Transactions and Fronting, issued by the Department of Trade and Industry, be established during such enquiry / investigation, the onus will be on the Bidder / contractor to prove that fronting does not exist. Failure to do so within a period of 14 days from date of notification may invalidate the bid / contract and may also result in the restriction of the

Bidder /contractor to conduct business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten years, in addition to any other remedies the CSIR may have against the Bidder / contractor concerned.

5 PRICING PROPOSAL

- 5.1 Pricing must be provided in South African Rand (including all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts).
- 5.2 Prices that are subject to escalation and exchange rate fluctuations are to be clearly indicated, with the currency and ROE used in the quotation must be clearly indicated.
- 5.3 Price should include additional cost elements such as travel cost, freight, insurance until acceptance, duty where applicable, etc.
- 5.4 Payment will be according to the CSIR Payment Terms and Conditions.
- 5.5 Please provide a detail pricing using a Pricing Schedule/Bill of Quantities outlined under Annexure D. Pricing must strictly be in accordance with the Pricing Schedule.

6 APPOINTMENT OF SERVICE PROVIDER

- 6.1 The contract will be awarded to a maximum of four (4) tenderers who score the highest total number of points on technical/functionality scores during the evaluation process.
 - If two or more tenders scores an equal total number of points, the award would be made to tenderer that has highest points for preference points.
 - If two or more tenders scores an equal total number of points in all respects, the award would be decided by the drawing of lots.
- 6.2 Appointment as a successful service provider shall be subject to the parties agreeing to mutually acceptable contractual terms and conditions. In the event of the parties failing to reach such agreement, the CSIR reserves the right to appoint alternative suppliers through normal procurement process outside the appointed panel.
- Awarding of contracts will be published on the same platform where the bid was published, and no regret letters will be sent to unsuccessful bidders.

7 UTILISATION OF PANEL GUIDELINES

7.1 A Request for Quotation (RFQ) will be issued to the relevant appointed panel members on a per project basis which will be evaluated on Price and preference points as per the 80/20

- principle per thePreferential Policy and Procurement Framework Act (PPPFA) 2022 regulations. The appointed provider through the RFQ process will be issued with a formal purchase order.
- 7.2 The selection of the services providers from the appointed panel for the RFQ process will be performed on a rotational basis. There is no guarantee that a service provider on the appointed panel will be contracted for the duration of this contract, and there is no guarantee that the CSIR will procure all the items as included in this RFP document.
- 7.3 Should the successful bidders not be in a position to provide the CSIR with the required maintenance, repairs and replacement of any plumbing installation and equipment to the CSIR via the RFQ process, the CSIR then reserves the right to contact other providers through a separate procurement process.
- 7.4 Rotational model: The invitation of price quotations from the approved list of contractors per task order or service will be done on a rotation basis in such a manner that ongoing competition amongst contractors is promoted.
- 7.5 The CSIR reserves the to utilize service providers across operational zones borders if there are capacity constraints. The CSIR reserves the right to procure any of the designated and/or non-designated/services using another contract.
- 7.6 The CSIR reserves the to utilize service providers across operational zones borders if there are capacity constraints. The CSIR reserves the right to procure any of the designated and/or non-designated/services using another contract.
- 7.7 Being appointed in on this contract does not in any way guarantee a right to perform any required work in accordance with this contract. The CSIR has inhouse plumbing maintenance team and reserves the right to allocate the work internally.

8 SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT

8.1 Upon award the CSIR and the successful bidder will conclude a Service Level Agreement

in line with applicable form of contract (i.e. <u>Draft Supplier Agreement</u>) regulating the specific

terms and conditions applicable to the services being procured by the CSIR, more or less

in the format of the draft Service Level Indicators (Annexure J) included in this tender pack.

8.2 Bidder(s) are requested to:

a. Comment on draft Service Level Indicators and where necessary, make proposals to

the indicators;

b. Explain each comment and/or amendment; and

c. Use an easily identifiable colour font or "track changes" for all changes and/or

amendments to the Service Level Indicators for ease of reference.

8.3 The CSIR reserves the right to accept or reject any or all amendments or additions proposed

by a bidder if such amendments or additions are unacceptable to the CSIR or pose a risk

to the organisation.

9 ENQUIRIES AND CONTACT WITH THE CSIR

Any enquiry regarding this RFP shall be submitted in writing to CSIR to the email and format

outlined in the table on cover page of this RFP document.

Any other contact with CSIR personnel involved in this tender is not permitted during the

RFP process other than as required through existing service arrangements or as requested

by the CSIR as part of the RFP process.

10 MEDIUM OF COMMUNICATION

All documentation submitted in response to this RFP must be in English.

11 CORRECTNESS OF RESPONSES

11.1 The bidder must confirm satisfaction regarding the correctness and validity of their proposal

and that all prices and rates quoted cover all the work/items specified in the RFP. The

prices and rates quoted must cover all obligations under any resulting contract.

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11.2 The bidder accepts that any mistakes regarding prices and calculations will be at their own

risk.

12 VERIFICATION OF DOCUMENTS

12.1 Bidders should check the numbers of the pages to satisfy themselves that none is missing

or duplicated. No liability will be accepted by the CSIR in regard to anything arising from the

fact that pages are missing or duplicated.

12.2 Pricing schedule and specific goals credentials should be submitted with the proposal, but

as a separate document and no such information should be available in the technical

proposal.

13 RESPONSIBILITY FOR SUB-CONTRACTORS AND BIDDER'S PERSONNEL

A bidder is responsible for ensuring that its personnel (including agents, officers, directors,

employees, advisors and other representatives), its sub-contractors (if any) and personnel

of its sub-contractors comply with all terms and conditions of this bid. In the event that the

CSIR allows a bidder to make use of sub-contractors, such sub-contractors will at all times

remain the responsibility of the bidder and the CSIR will not under any circumstances be

liable for any losses or damages incurred by or caused by such sub-contractors.

14 ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

14.1 A bidder shall not assume that information and/or documents supplied to CSIR, at any time

prior to this request, are still available to CSIR, and shall consequently not make any

reference to such information document in its response to this request.

14.2 Copies of any affiliations, memberships and/or accreditations that support your submission

must be included in the tender.

14.3 In case of proposal/s from a joint venture, the following must be submitted together with the

proposal/s:

A joint venture agreement signed by both parties clearly indication the lead partner,

including split of work;

Copy of a valid certificate or consolidated B-BBEE score card;

• The Tax Compliance Status (TCS) or CSD Report of each joint venture partner;

- Proof of ownership/shareholder certificates/copies; and
- Company registration certificate/s.
- 14.4 An omission to disclose material information, a factual inaccuracy, and/or a misrepresentation of fact may result in the disqualification of a tender, or cancellation of any subsequent contract.
- 14.5 No goods and/or services should be delivered to the CSIR without an official CSIR Purchase order or signed supplier agreement. The CSIR purchase order number must be quoted on the invoice. Invoices without CSIR purchase order numbers will be returned to supplier.
- 14.6 Failure to comply with any of the terms and conditions as set out in this document will invalidate the Proposal.

15 SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The CSIR reserves the right to:

- 15.1 Extend the closing date of this RFP;
- 15.2 Correct any mistakes before closing date and time of the tender that may have been in the Bid documents or occurred at any stage of the tender process;
- 15.3 Verify any information contained in the bidder's submission;
- 15.4 Request documentary proof regarding the bidder's submission;
- 15.5 Carry out site inspections, product evaluations or explanatory meetings in order to verify the nature and quality of the product/service offered by the bidder(s) or verify any information whether before or after the adjudication of this RFP;
- 15.6 Award this tender to a bidder that did not score the highest total number of points, only in accordance with Section 2(1)(f) of the PPPFA (Act 5 of 2000);
- 15.7 Request audited financial statements or other documents for the purpose of a due diligence exercise to determine if the bidder will be able to execute the contract;
- 15.8 Award this RFP as a whole or in part;
- 15.9 Award this RFP to multiple bidders;
- 15.10 Cancel and/or terminate the tender process at any stage, including after the Closing Date and/or after presentations have been made, and/or after tenders have been evaluated and/or after the preferred bidder(s) have been notified of their status as such;
- 15.11 Post tender negotiate on any elements on the bid, including but not limited to technical, transformation, price, and contractual terms and conditions.;

15.12 Not to award a contract to a bidder who is associated with a security breach that materially adversely affects other entities or if any directors or officers of a bidder are formally accused of fraudulent or illegal conduct which, would harm the CSIR's reputation by its continued association with the bidder.

16 CONFLICT OF INTEREST, CORRUPTION AND FRAUD

- 16.1 The CSIR reserves its right to disqualify any bidder who either itself or any of whose members (save for such members who hold a minority interest in the bidder through shares listed on any recognised stock exchange), indirect members (being any person or entity who indirectly holds at least a 15% interest in the bidder other than in the context of shares listed on a recognised stock exchange), directors or members of senior management, whether in respect of CSIR or any other government organ or entity and whether from the Republic of South Africa or otherwise ("Government Entity")
 - engages in any collusive tendering, anti-competitive conduct, or any other similar conduct, including but not limited to any collusion with any other bidder in respect of the subject matter of this bid;
 - b. seeks any assistance, other than assistance officially provided by a Government Entity, from any employee, advisor or other representative of a Government Entity in order to obtain any unlawful advantage in relation to procurement or services provided or to be provided to a Government Entity;
 - c. makes or offers any gift, gratuity, anything of any value or other inducement, to any Government Entity's officers, directors, employees, advisors or other representatives in order to obtain any unlawful advantage in relation to procurement or services provided or to be provided to a Government Entity;
 - accepts anything of value or an inducement that would or may provide financial gain, advantage or benefit in relation to procurement or services provided or to be provided to a Government Entity;
 - e. pays or agrees to pay to any person any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift or any other consideration, that is contingent upon or results from, the award of any tender, contract, right or entitlement which is in any way related to procurement or the rendering of any services to a Government Entity;
 - f. has in the past engaged in any matter referred to above; or

has been found guilty in a court of law on charges of fraud and/or forgery, regardless g.

of whether or not a prison term was imposed and despite such bidder, member or

director's name not specifically appearing on the List of Tender Defaulters kept at

National Treasury.

17 MISREPRESENTATION DURING THE LIFECYCLE OF THE CONTRACT

17.1 The bidder should note that the terms of its Tender will be incorporated in the proposed

contract by reference and that the CSIR relies upon the bidder's Tender as a material

representation in making an award to a successful bidder and in concluding an agreement

with the bidder.

17.2 It follows therefore that misrepresentations in a Tender may give rise to service termination

and a claim by the CSIR against the bidder notwithstanding the conclusion of the Service

Level Agreement between the CSIR and the bidder for the provision of the Service in

question. In the event of a conflict between the bidder's proposal and the Service Level

Agreement concluded between the parties, the Service Level Agreement will prevail.

18 PREPARATION COSTS AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

The Bidder will bear all its costs in preparing, submitting and presenting any response or

Tender to this bid and all other costs incurred by it throughout the bid process. Furthermore,

no statement in this bid will be construed as placing the CSIR, its employees or agents

under any obligation whatsoever, including in respect of costs, expenses or losses incurred

by the bidder(s) in the preparation of their response to this bid.

A bidder participates in this bid process entirely at its own risk and cost. The CSIR shall not

be liable to compensate a bidder on any grounds whatsoever for any costs incurred or any

damages suffered as a result of the Bidder's participation in this Bid process.

19 **INDEMNITY**

If a bidder breaches the conditions of this bid and, as a result of that breach, the CSIR incurs

costs or damages (including, without limitation, the cost of any investigations, procedural

impairment, repetition of all or part of the bid process and/or enforcement of intellectual

property rights or confidentiality obligations), then the bidder indemnifies and holds the

CSIR harmless from any and all such costs which the CSIR may incur and for any damages

or losses the CSIR may suffer.

20 PRECEDENCE

This document will prevail over any information provided during any briefing session

whether oral or written, unless such written information provided, expressly amends this

document by reference.

21 TAX COMPLIANCE

No tender shall be awarded to a bidder who is not tax compliant. The CSIR reserves the

right to withdraw an award made, or cancel a contract concluded with a successful bidder

in the event that it is established that such bidder was in fact not tax compliant at the time

of the award or has submitted a fraudulent Tax Clearance Certificate to the CSIR, or whose

verification against the Central Supplier Database (CSD) proves non-compliant. The CSIR

further reserves the right to cancel a contract with a successful bidder in the event that such

bidder does not remain tax compliant for the full term of the contract.

22 TENDER DEFAULTERS AND RESTRICTED SUPPLIERS

No tender shall be awarded to a bidder whose name (or any of its members, directors,

partners or trustees) appear on the Register of Tender Defaulters kept by National Treasury,

or who have been placed on National Treasury's List of Restricted Suppliers. The CSIR

reserves the right to withdraw an award, or cancel a contract concluded with a Bidder should

it be established, at any time, that a bidder has been blacklisted with National Treasury by

another government institution.

23 GOVERNING LAW

South African law governs this bid and the bid response process. The bidder agrees to

submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the South African courts in any dispute of any kind

that may arise out of or in connection with the subject matter of this bid, the bid itself and all

processes associated with the bid.

24 CONFIDENTIALITY

Except as may be required by operation of law, by a court or by a regulatory authority having

appropriate jurisdiction, no information contained in or relating to this bid or a bidder's

tender(s) will be disclosed by any bidder or other person not officially involved with the

CSIR's examination and evaluation of a Tender.

No part of the bid may be distributed, reproduced, stored or transmitted, in any form or by

any means, electronic, photocopying, recording or otherwise, in whole or in part except for

the purpose of preparing a Tender. This bid and any other documents supplied by the CSIR

remain proprietary to the CSIR and must be promptly returned to the CSIR upon request

together with all copies, electronic versions, excerpts or summaries thereof or work derived

there from.

Throughout this bid process and thereafter, bidder(s) must secure the CSIR's written

approval prior to the release of any information that pertains to (i) the potential work or

activities to which this bid relates; or (ii) the process which follows this bid. Failure to adhere

to this requirement may result in disqualification from the bid process and civil action.

25 AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS

Should funds no longer be available to pay for the execution of the responsibilities of this

bid, the CSIR may terminate the Agreement at its own discretion or temporarily suspend all

or part of the services by notice to the successful bidder who shall immediately make

arrangements to stop the performance of the services and minimize further expenditure:

Provided that the successful bidder shall thereupon be entitled to payment in full for the

services delivered, up to the date of cancellation or suspension.

26 PERSONAL INFORMATION

26.1 Each Party consents to the other Party holding and processing "personal information" (as

defined in the POPI Act) relating to it for legal, personnel, administrative and management

purposes (including, if applicable, any "special personal information" relating to him/her, as

defined in the POPI Act). Notwithstanding the generality of the aforesaid, each Party hereby

undertakes to comply with all relevant provisions of the POPI Act and any other applicable

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- data protection laws. The bidder further agrees to comply with all CSIR's reasonable internal governance requirements pertaining to data protection.
- 26.2 Each Party consents to the other Party making such information available to those who provide products or services to such parties (such as advisers, regulatory authorities, governmental or quasi-governmental organisations and potential purchasers of such Party or any part of their business).
- 26.3 While performing any activity where a Party is handling personal information as a "responsible party" (as defined in the POPI Act), each Party undertakes that it will process the personal information strictly in accordance with the terms of the POPI Act, this Contract, and the other Party's instructions from time to time, and take appropriate operational measures to safeguard the data against any unauthorised access.
- 26.4 Each Party acknowledges that in the course of conducting business with each other, each Party intends to maintain and process personal information about the other Party in an internal database. By signing this Contract, each Party consents to the maintenance and processing of such personal information.

Where relevant, the bidder shall procure that all of its personnel, agents, representatives, contractors, sub-contractors and mandataries shall comply with the provisions of this clause 26 (Personal Information). The CSIR shall be entitled on reasonable notice to conduct an inspection or audit bidders compliance with the requisite POPI Act safeguards.

27 CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT BOARD (CIDB)

- 27.1 Only those tenderers who are registered with the CIDB or are capable of being so prior to the closing date and time of this RFP submissions, with a grading of **2SO and higher** class of construction works, will be considered.
- 27.2 Joint ventures are eligible to submit proposals provided that:
 - Every member of the joint venture is registered with the CIDB.
 - The lead partner has a contractor grading designation in the 2SO and higher class of construction work; or not lower than one level below the required grading designation in

the class of works construction works under consideration and possess the required recognition status.

 The combined contractor grading designation calculated in accordance with the Construction Industry Development Regulations is equal to 2SO and higher class of construction work.

28 DISCLAIMER

This RFP is a request for proposals only and not an offer document. Answers to this RFP must not be construed as acceptance of an offer or imply the existence of a contract between the parties. By submission of its proposal, bidders shall be deemed to have satisfied themselves with and to have accepted all Terms & Conditions of this RFP. The CSIR makes no representation, warranty, assurance, guarantee or endorsements to bidder concerning the RFP, whether with regard to its accuracy, completeness or otherwise and the CSIR shall have no liability towards the bidder or any other party in connection therewith.

29 TERMS OF REFERENCE

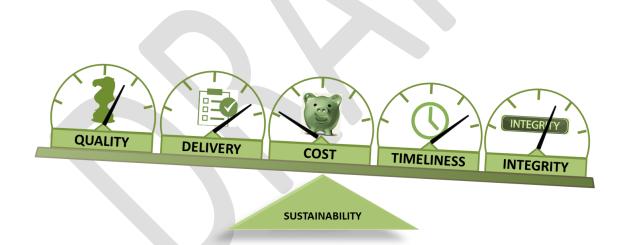
1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the Service Level Indicators is to guide and document the expectations and requirements of the services to be rendered to the Tendering Institutions by the Service Provider.

This document may be used as the benchmark against which reviews and, as appropriate, modifications to the service provided by the Service Provider shall take place.

2. KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

Key performance indicators (KPIs) are management tools designed to monitor supplier performance and help meet the goals, objectives and service levels of the contract.



3. RANGE OF SERVICES

The Services rendered are reflected in the Scope of Work (**Annexure B**: Technical Specification).

4. EMERGENCY WORK

Emergency will include situations where the continued dysfunctional state of equipment/infrastructure will have a disastrous impact on the CSIR's capability to supply water, i.e., water leaks, etc.

The work procedure for emergency maintenance projects is therefore as follows:

- a. The service provider shall respond to call outs services 24 hours, 7 days a week at the contracted rates. Emergencies must be attended to within 6 hours depending on the nature of repairs.
- b. The service provider must be able to provide urgent or emergency services whenever it is required.
- c. CSIR representative will assess the situation and approach the appointed contractor to attend to the urgent or emergency maintenance work as speedily as possible. The request can be in a form of an email or telephonic call.
- d. The appointed service provider shall follow all statutory provisions and safety rules for carrying this work including but not limited to SANS 1808, 10252, 10400-P and the OHS Act, no 85 of 1993.
- e. All work, personnel, materials and equipment shall comply with the relevant SANS specifications and requirements of the Occupational Health and Safety Act of 1993 (Act No. 85 of 1993).
- f. The contractor shall create a safety file for the activities to be performed on site. Safety file shall be submitted to Employer's Agent's or his Representative's for acceptance. The content of the safety file for each activity shall be stipulated by CSIR's representative.
- g. The contractor will be required to prepare a quotation for the emergency maintenance work done. Quotations submitted for emergency work done, shall be clearly state and quantify work done is an emergency.
- h. After CSIR representative assessed quotation and agrees with the contents of the quotation, invoices will be paid accordingly.

5. ADHOC WORK

Ad-hoc work includes upgrade, alteration to existing installation, reservoir cleaning services and specialized services such as pipeline inspection, scanning, leak detection.

- a. CSIR representative will compile and submit itemized quotation together with the technical description and scope of ad hoc work required to the appointed contractor.
- b. The contractor must ensure that the requirements stated in the quotation are unambiguous and fully understood prior to preparing the detailed proposal / quotation. A site visit may be required for the contractor to prepare detailed proposal / quotation.
- c. The appointed contractor will submit itemized quotation, a comprehensive quality programme, crafts manhours and the proposed project schedule to CSIR representative.
- d. The proposal from the appointed contractor will include proposed milestones and cashflow projections.
- e. An official instruction will be issued by the CSIR representative.
- f. No work shall commence if the contractor is not in possession of the following:
 - Official work instruction,
 - Approved Quality Control Plans (QCPs),
 - approved design drawings and SOPs (where applicable).

6. SPARES MANAGEMENT

Service provider will provide spares for repairs and maintenance. The service provider shall source one spares quotation for emergency breakdown. Three quotations will be required for planned or ad hoc work. The service provider will add percentage mark-up on spares as per contract agreement
