South Africa Mainstream Renewable Power Developments (Pty) Ltd (hereinafter referred to as Mainstream) received three Amended Environmental Authorisations (EAs), dated 10 November 2016 (DEA Reference Numbers: 12/12/20/1782/1; 12/12/20/1782/2; and 12/12/20/1782/3), from the National Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) (now operating as the Department of Environment, Forestry and Fisheries (DEFF)) to construct and operate the Rietrug Wind Energy Facility (WEF), Sutherland WEF and Sutherland 2 WEF. Subsequent to these EAs being issued, DEA granted EAs for two Applications for Substantive Amendment which were undertaken for each WEF.

Notice is hereby given in terms of Regulation 41 of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations of 2014 (as amended) of the National Environmental Management Act (Act 107 of 1998) (NEMA) of a third application being submitted for a Substantive Amendment to EA for each WEF. Mainstream wishes to apply for the following amendments:

- 1. An increase from the authorised 150 m hub height and rotor diameter to 200 m hub height and rotor diameter.**
- 2. To amend the name and contact details of the holder of the EA.**

The EA Amendment processes will comply with Regulations 31 to 33 of the 2014 NEMA EIA Regulations as amended. Three separate applications for Amendment to EA have been submitted to DEFF as the competent authority; i.e. one for each WEF. Although three separate applications have been submitted to DEFF and three separate Draft Amendment Reports have been prepared, an integrated Public Participation Process for all three Amendment Processes are being undertaken as the WEFs are located within the same geographical area and constitute the same type of activity.

The Draft Amendment Reports are being released for a 30-day commenting period extending from **4 October 2019 to 4 November 2019**. Comments must be submitted to the CSIR on or before this date using the details provided below. A hard copy of each report is available at the Sutherland and Laingsburg Public Libraries. South Africa Mainstream Renewable Power Developments (Pty) Ltd (hereinafter referred to as Mainstream) received three Amended Environmental Authorisations (EAs), dated 10 November 2016 (DEA Reference Numbers: 12/12/20/1782/1; 12/12/20/1782/2; and 12/12/20/1782/3), from the National Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) (now operating as the Department of Environment, Forestry and Fisheries (DEFF)) to construct and operate the Sutherland Wind Energy Facility (WEF), Sutherland 2 WEF, and Rietrug WEF. Notice is hereby given in terms of Regulation 41 of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations of 2014 (as amended) of the National Environmental Management Act (Act 107 of 1998) (NEMA) that Mainstream is proposing to amend the name and contact details of the holder of the EA and the turbine specifications of each of the separately authorised WEFs (as part of a Substantive Amendment process). The EA holder wishes to apply for an increase from the authorised 150 m hub height and rotor diameter to 200 m hub height and rotor diameter. The Rietrug and Sutherland 2 WEFs are located within the Northern Cape, approximately 23 km south of Sutherland and 50 km north of Laingsburg. It falls under the jurisdiction of the Namakwa District Municipality (DM) and the Karoo Hoogland Local Municipality (LM). The proposed Sutherland WEF is located in the Northern Cape, within the afore-mentioned district and local municipalities. However, a portion of the Sutherland WEF falls within the Western Cape, under the jurisdiction of the Central Karoo DM and the Laingsburg LM.

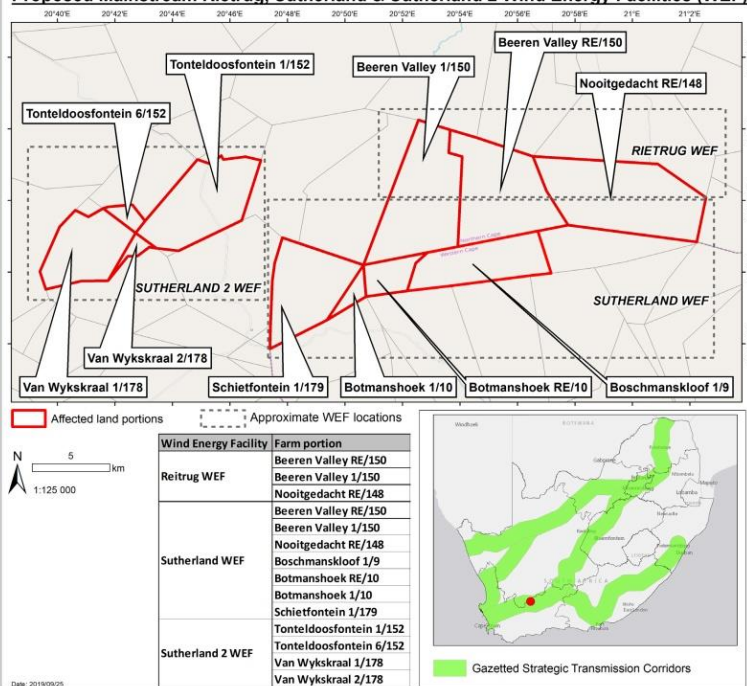

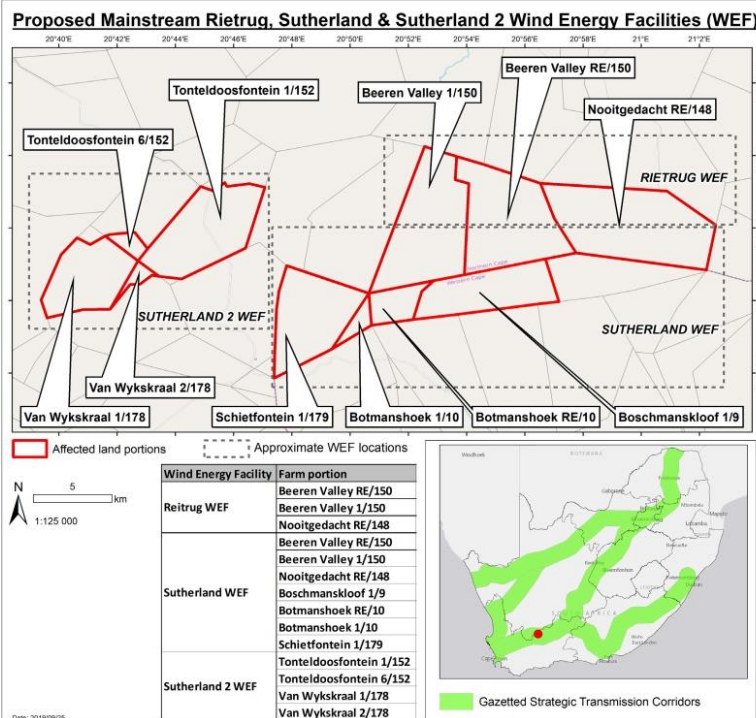

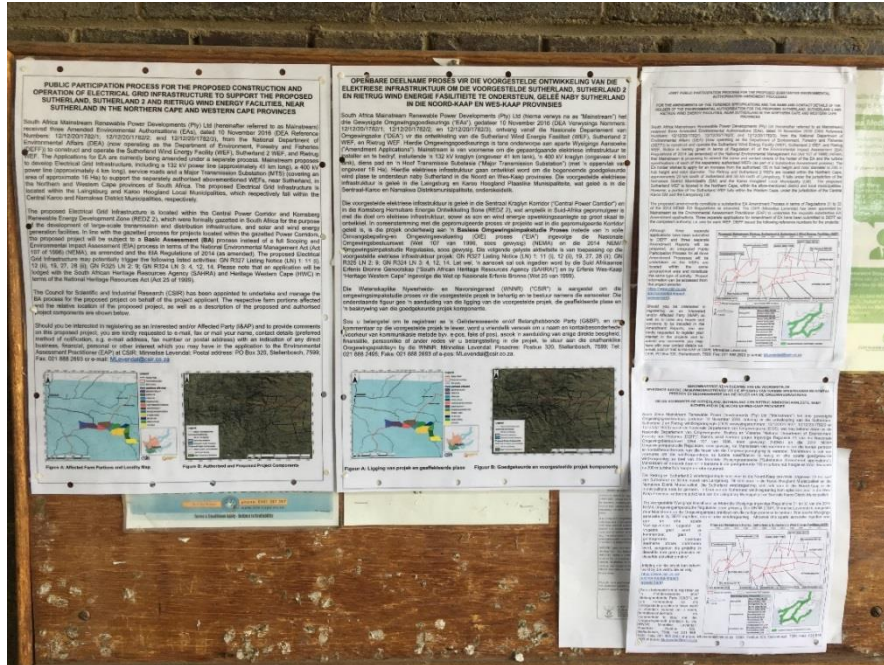

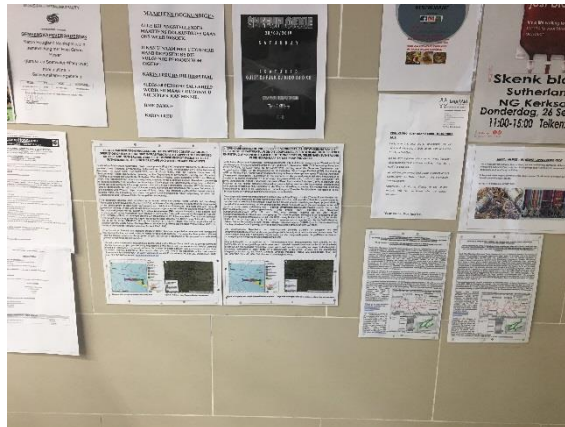
